#### 2025 OUSTANDING COMMUNITY LEADER: Dr. PEGGY MONTES



Dr. Montes's journey started as a teacher, counselor, and interim assistant principal in several Chicago Public Schools. She was later appointed a cabinet member in Chicago City government. She created the first Chicago Women's History Month in 1986. Dr. Montes is also the Founder of the Bronzeville Children's Museum, the first and only African American children's museum in America.

#### 2025 OUSTANDING COMMUNITY LEADER: Dr. DORENE WIESE



Dr. Wiese is the founding President of the American Indian Association of Illinois and President of Native American Educational Services. She has served as an urban American Indian educator in Chicago for 58 years, providing a lifetime of service in teaching and preserving Chicago Native history, music, photography, film, dance, and art through a variety of programs. She is an enrolled member of the Minnesota Chippewa Tribe-White Earth and dreams that through the training of Native youth, Native Chicago culture and history will live on.


